

About the Park and Asombro

The 935-acre Chihuahuan Desert Nature Park is owned and operated by the nonprofit Asombro Institute for Science Education. It serves as Asombro's outdoor classroom for student field trips and public education programs. Asombro also delivers award-winning classroom/schoolyard science lessons and teacher workshops, collectively serving more than 22,000 students and 3,000 adults annually. Trails



Desert Discovery Trail (1.2 mile)

This loop trail circles Vista Hill and provides an overlook of an arroyo. A 150-seat amphitheater halfway along the loop provides shade and beautiful views of the Jornada Basin. The western half of the trail is moderately steep and rocky. A 0.3-mile steep and rocky spur trail leads to the top of Vista Hill. Pick up a self-guided booklet at the trailhead to learn more at 11 numbered stops along the trail.



Desert Experience Mini-Trail (0.2 mile)

Paved, easy, wide loop trail with a gentle slope and interpretive signs to teach visitors about plants, animals, soil, and people of the Chihuahuan Desert.



Arroyo Trail (0.4 mile)

Walk along the edge and bottom of an arroyo that carries runoff from the Doña Ana Mountains after heavy rain. An interpretive sign teaches how scientists read soils in the arroyo walls to learn about past climate in the desert. This trail connects the Yucca and Desert Discovery Trails. Some sections are very sandy.



Yucca Trail (0.5.mile)

Connecting the Gateway to the Desert and Arroyo Trails, this gently sloping trail takes visitors by large yuccas and into the heart of the Nature Park.



Gateway to the Desert Trail (0.6 mile)

This easy, flat loop trail provides an introduction to the sights, sounds, and smells of the desert. Interpretive signs explain the Doña Ana Mountains, plants, animals, and local science of the desert. The trail intersects the Yucca Trail, providing access to the other Park trails.
