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New and Expanded Science Education for 2013/14

The 2013/14 school year is well underway, and the Asombro staff is busy engaging students in new science programs as well as expanded versions of successful programs from previous years.

Elementary school students delight in Asombro's classroom and field trip programs. Several of these programs connect science with the new Common Core State Standards in language arts and math. Teachers have their hands full as they work to meet the new standards. We make sure science isn't forgotten by modeling programs that connect science with new standards in other subjects.

Third graders at East Picacho Elementary School, J. Paul Taylor Academy, and Las Cruces Catholic School are part of this year's *Experience Science Program*, funded in part by a grant from El Paso Electric. Program Coordinator Rink Somerday and volunteer Donna Yargosz visit each class monthly for hands-on science programs.

Thanks to a generous grant from the Wolslager Foundation, 5th graders at 10 schools in Las Cruces and the Gadsden Independent School District are participating in the expanded *Science Interns Project*. Fifth graders work with Asombro staff to learn a science topic and then teach this information to younger students at their schools through hands-on stations. The 5th grade Science Interns gain science understanding, leadership qualities, and teaching skills while the younger students learn science and gain role models.

Asombro staff will also help students merge science and language arts this year through the *Desert Stories* pilot project, funded by the Hunt Family Foundation. Asombro staff are busy planning and creating the curriculum for the project, which will engage students in learning science and presenting science content in a writing project. The project will launch in January 2013.

Asombro continues to engage middle school students in hands-on science programs this year. The Las Cruces Public School District is once again providing funding so Asombro can offer inquiry-based science programs to every 7th grader in the district. Part of this *Stepping Out for Science Inquiry* program also includes field trips to the Chihuahuan Desert Nature Park for many 7th graders.

Middle and high school students from six schools are also participating in Asombro's new *Research Experience Field Trip* program, which includes pre-field trip classroom programs, a field trip, and post-field trip classroom programs. Teachers choose the topic Asombro will cover from a varied list including geology, biodiversity, the desert biome, and more.

Science Education Specialist Stephanie Haan-Amato is leading another new program at Vista Middle School. Once a week, students explore the ecology of their schoolyard with her. They are creating a field guide to share their new knowledge with "ecosystem pen pals" in San Diego, California

Finally, the *Desert Data Jam* is back for its third year. This competition for high school students has been very successful in getting students to work with real data sets and design ways to explain data to nonscientists. We're proud that our project is being replicated this year in Baltimore, Maryland and Miami, Florida, expanding this innovative project to students in other parts of the United States.

As you can see, Asombro will be busy this year! We are very grateful to all of you for your support of unique science education in our community.

NMSU Zoology Class Explores the Nature Park

Dr. Timothy Wright from New Mexico State University gave students the opportunity to get out of the classroom and explore the desert on Sunday, September 22nd.

Dr. Wright brought his Zoology class on a field trip to the Chihuahuan Desert Nature Park to gain hands on experience with local wildlife. Students hiked the trails at the Nature Park, cataloging a variety of animal species both at dawn and at dusk.

New Mexico is among the top five most biologically diverse states in the nation, and autumn is an ideal time to see what the Land of Enchantment has to offer. Students learned first hand why our state ranks as the second most diverse state for bird species and the third most diverse state for reptiles. Zoology students also took a night shift to see the different host of species that only come out after dark.
