

Frequency of Four Bird Species in Doña Ana County

These data come from eBird, a project run by the Cornell Lab of Ornithology. eBird is a community science program; the data are collected by people who record bird sightings. Anyone can use a checklist to record where and when they see birds, what species they observe, and how many there are of each species. The checklists are reviewed by experts to make sure the birds were correctly identified, and then the data are shared online. The data table shows four common bird species in Doña Ana County, New Mexico, where Las Cruces is located. The numbers in the table are the percent frequency, or the percent of checklists submitted that month in Doña Ana County that reported seeing the bird species.
